**Sub: Reservation of seats in Diploma Level technical courses for States / Union - Territories lacking in such facilities, and for foreign and other categories of students for academic sessions 2020-21 - regarding.**

Sir,

I am directed to state that this Ministry has an ongoing scheme of "Reservation of seats in Engineering / Technology / Architecture / Pharmacy courses conducted at Diploma level technical Institutions approved by the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE)", for States and Union Territories (UTs) which do not have Engineering Colleges / Polytechnics or lack facilities for education in specific fields of Technical Education, and for certain categories including foreign students.

2. The reservation of seats is made under the Scheme for the following nominating agencies:

- i. State Governments / UT Administrations.
- ii. Central Tibetan Schools Administration (CTSA)
- iii. Indian Council for Child Welfare (ICCW) - for recipients of children's bravery awards.
- iv. Ministry of External Affairs (Welfare) - for wards of government employees posted in Indian Missions abroad.

3. The details of the seats allocated in your state in Diploma level Technical Courses for 2020-21, in respect of the above categories are given in the statements attached. Allocation of Diploma Level seats has been made for North Eastern States, UTs (namely Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Daman & Diu and Dadra & Nagar Haveli, and Lakshadweep), ICCW, CTSA and Ministry of External Affairs (Welfare Division).


4. The seats offered in private institutions, according to the AICTE's letter No. 314-I /CCF / RES /94 dated 13.01.95 are free seats, over and above the sanctioned intake strength. These seats are supernumerary in nature and do not affect the total

strength / intake of students. Selection process guidelines formulated and intimated vide letter No. 32-2/2013-TS.II dated 23<sup>rd</sup> August, 2013 are enclosed herewith.

5. All other terms and conditions will remain same as followed during last Academic Year.

**Subject:** Reservation of seats by Ministry of HRD in Diploma level technical courses for States/UTs lacking in such facilities and foreign and other categories of students - reg.

Sir,

A Committee was set up by the Ministry of Human Resources Development to examine the process of allocation of supernumerary seats at diploma level in the AICTE approved technical institutions/ polytechnics to develop a transparent system to guide the State Govts./ Union Territory to select the candidates. It has been decided that while selection of candidates is made the following procedure may be followed:

- o/c
- i) The seat matrix based on the available courses, State-wise, will be notified to all designated admission authorities and the beneficiary States.
  - ii) The designated admission authority under this scheme in the beneficiary State will seek applications from students desirous of taking such admissions. The beneficiary state will seek applications from students by suitably advertising or by suitable notifications against the designated quota course wise.
  - iii) The designated admission authority shall be the Principal Secretary Technical Education/ Higher Education of the State/ Union Territory.
  - iv) The beneficiary state shall prepare a merit list against the applications received based on 10<sup>th</sup> total marks and by tie-breaking on 10<sup>th</sup> Science marks, 10<sup>th</sup> English marks in that order.
  - v) The beneficiary State will effect seats as per the above merit list in the designated/ allotted polytechnics as per the seat matrix based on the preferences of the students, however, governed by the order of merit.
  - vi) The beneficiary state shall prepare a MIS of students seeking admission and those allotted within 15 days of completion of admission with intimation to the Director, Technical Section, Ministry of HRD with a copy to AICTE.

The Schedule to be followed for admission is as shown in the enclosed Table.
